

St Martin-in-the-Fields Charity helps people who are experiencing, or at risk of becoming homeless. We are best known for our annual BBC Radio 4 Christmas Appeal with St Martin-in-the-Fields. The money we raise directly supports people through The Connection at St Martin-in-the-Fields and across the UK through the Vicar's Relief Fund (VRF) and the Frontline Network.

The VRF helps people experiencing homelessness through small, quick grants that prevent eviction or help people access accommodation. We award grants of up to £350, and we usually process grant requests in 1-3 days. We give grants to people across the UK through frontline workers.

As [our client] was due to move in, the council reversed its decision to pay rent in advance and he was facing instant eviction onto the streets again. The Vicar's Relief grant saved the day, allowing him to have the property. Since moving in, he has been engaging successfully with alcohol and gambling addiction services and has been able to have full access to his little son. These factors have been crucial in improving his mental health significantly.





We will continue to be guided by the voice of frontline workers and the people they work with. Our work continues to be supported by the BBC Radio 4 Christmas Appeal.


